Metering Pump Instructions

The metering pumps included with AeroMarine epoxies are designed to dispense equal volumes of liquid. When using with AeroMarine Products 300/21 epoxy, you must pump two strokes of resin for every one pump of hardener. Each stroke dispenses approximately one ounce of liquid. We recommend pumping the product into cups to ensure you are getting the appropriate amounts.

The pumps need to be primed before the first use. If they will be stored for a long time, remove the pumps from the containers, clean them with acetone and prime them before using again.

Pumps are not suggested for use with moisture sensitive products like urethanes.

Pumps are not recommended for use with thicker viscosity materials like our 400 resin, White and Grey colored epoxy resins or 11 hardener.

Do NOT leave the pumps in the containers longer than 30 days.
