## Pecan Flour

The pecan flour is used with AeroMarine epoxies to thicken the resin for wood rot and termite damage repair, generally in windows, fencing, non-structural beams, and trim. Pecan Flour is a great filler for thickening polyester and epoxy resins but it can add significant weight to your project. You can add in fumed silica along with the microspheres to prevent sagging. We recommend pre-measuring the resin and hardener and mixing the pecan flour in with the resin prior to adding the hardener to save your work life. Once the pecan flour is thoroughly mixed into the resin add the hardener. Do not use pecan flour with urethanes as it can hold moisture.
